• University studies and didactics. Types (subject, modular) and structure of study programs. Didactic systems (student-centered studies, problem-based learning). Study programs based on competencies and learning outcomes. Development of study programs. Development of general competencies. Links between learning outcomes and study content. Planning and implementation of the study / subject / course program.

- Organization of the process of teaching and learning psychology. Designing a course and syllabus, the layout of training elements, and selection of appropriate tools to convey them. Content of teaching (learning) a psychology course. Objectives and tasks of a course. Structure of the subject and links to other disciplines.
- Structure and course of classes. Activity plan. Principles of activity planning: expediency, topics (preparation required, order of presentation according to the scheme adopted by psychology, relationship of topics), methods, selection of technical means. Compiling a bibliography.
- Selection methods of teaching and studying. Study methods (lectures, seminars, consultations, independent work) and teaching / learning methods (group work, discussions, case studies, tests, project work, etc.): theoretical and practical aspects. Creating a learning environment. Teaching skills, peculiarities of presenting information to the audience.
- Use of technical tools in teaching psychology: conditions, assumptions, consequences. Functions and importance of the use of technical tools for development of teaching / learning materials; Planning of independent methodological learning with the help of technical tools. New technologies in the teaching / learning process.
- Assessment of student knowledge. Assessment forms (written, oral). Principles of evaluation. Feedback to students. Use of student assessments to improve teaching practice.
- Supervision of students' term papers and bachelor's theses. Creating a plan for independent work. Training students' research skills. Evaluation of the term and bachelor's thesis.
- Integration of doctoral studies, pedagogical activities, and practical activities of a psychologist. Academic ethics.
- There are 32 academic hours planned for classroom work.
