STUDIES:

- Students are given the opportunity to join the Student Research Network and choose a field of medicine from more than 50 specializations from the first year.
- In collaboration with the University of Groningen in the Netherlands, the simulation game GIMMICS has been integrated into pharmaceutical studies.
- More than 100 electives in English are offered each year.
- At present, as many as 20% of the students in the faculty are foreigners and their number is growing every year.

RESEARCH:

- The faculty is currently implementing more than 20 research projects in which scientists engage as researchers and project managers.
- In 2020, 396 high-level publications were published, of which 60% were prepared with foreign co-authors.
- The most important infrastructure required for scientific activities is located at the Faculty of Medicine, Vilnius University Hospital Santara Clinics, and Vilnius University Hospital Žalgiris Clinic.
- The Faculty of Medicine employs more than 800 staff, about 80% of whom are academic and research staff.
- Over 100 doctoral students study for a doctorate every year and about 20 dissertations are defended. The special Doctoral School will start operating in 2021.
- More than 100 national and international scientific events are held each year, including major international scientific conferences and congresses, such as the International Congress on Brain, Heart and Kidney 2020.



PARTNERSHIPS:

- The Faculty of Medicine has agreements with consortia of German, Israeli, and US hospitals where students have the opportunity to do internships.
- There are two active international councils of advisers: a groups of world-renowned researchers whose recommendations help conduct world-class research and improve study processes.
- To ensure quality and relevant knowledge, partnership professors from around the world (e.g., Sweden, Denmark, Portugal, New Zealand, etc.) come to give lectures to faculty students every year.
- The network of residency centres has been completed; it includes more than 100 Lithuanian healthcare institutions and provides residents of the faculty with the opportunity to study and work.
