<p>The concept of urbanization: the nature of the city and the concept of urbanity, the problem of defining urbanization, the factors and indicators of urbanization.</p> <p>Theories of urbanization development: stages of urbanization, theory of urbanization stages, cycles of development cities and urbanization, cycles of economic development and urbanization, convergence and divergence.</p> <p>City and social processes: fordist / postfordist city, modern / postmodern city, urbanity as a way of life, Marxist approach to the city, social differentiation / change in cities, gentrification, expression of colonialism / postcolonialism in cities, multiculturalism, change of urban governance.</p> <p>City and environment: change of urban natural environment, urban ecology, technogenization in the city.</p> <p>Spatial expression of urbanization: theories of spatial distribution of urban spaces (central places, diffusion), theories of development of internal structures of urban space, functional organization of the city and its development models, search for the ideal structure of urban space, basic ideas and concepts of urban planning.</p> <p>Current determinants of spatial urbanization: globalization, global urban network, demographic explosion and depopulation, metropolitanization, peculiarities of urban development policy and planning, sustainable urban development, perspective models of urban development.</p> <p>The main methodological attitudes of urban research: the city as a system, environmentalism, positivism, behaviorism, humanism, structuralism, managerialism, postmodernism, moral philosophy, critical urban geography.</p> <p>Main directions of urban research: morphological analysis, functional (ecological) research, cultural-genetic research, social research, behavioral research, lifestyle research, applied urban research, urban systems research.</p> <p>Quantitative urban research: peculiarities of urban statistics, peculiarities of multidimensional analysis, research of urban relations and connections between cities.</p> <p>Qualitative urban research: institutional research, analysis of actors, analysis of relationships.</p> <p>Peculiarities of the study of functional urban spaces: urban centers, residential areas, industrial areas, green areas, infrastructure.</p> <p>Peculiarities of cartographic analysis of cities: the question of city boundaries, mapping in the city, peculiarities of presenting statistical data, application of GIS in urban surveys.</p>
