COURSES AND CREDITS

In 2015 ISUP will offer approx. 50 courses taught in English at undergraduate and graduate level. They cover a wide range of classic business courses as well as more diverse, innovative and entrepreneurial courses, which draws on other academic disciplines. Each course is 7.5 ECTS, and students can enroll in a maximum of 2 courses (15 ECTS). The program runs for 6 weeks although selected three-week graduate courses followed by a three-week project assignment will be offered.

Each year ISUP invites a strong field of outstanding and dedicated faculty members from around the world, which creates an exciting and international atmosphere. The faculty members are highly experienced and have strong backgrounds within research. The vast majority holds a PhD from renowned universities.

SOCIAL PROGRAM

To complement our academic program, ISUP offers the opportunity to take part in an action-packed cultural and social program. Taking part in this program is a wonderful opportunity for international participants to get to know each other, Copenhagen, and Danish culture through specially arranged activities such as international dinners, city tours, folk dancing, and a weekend-trip to Berlin.

Classes start 29 June and the last day in class is 31 July 2015. The exam period runs from 3-6 August 2015. The Welcome Day for international students is 27 June (Saturday), so students should arrive in Copenhagen on 26 June (Friday).
