Trans-national Security – Research topics should focus on either traditional concerns of inter-state cooperation and conflict or issues of trans-national environmental degradation, pathogenic contagion, criminality (corruption, transnational organized crime, money laundering, drugs, arms human trafficking) and terrorism.
