NCCU has been ranked among the Top 100 Universities in Asia by QS for six consecutive years.



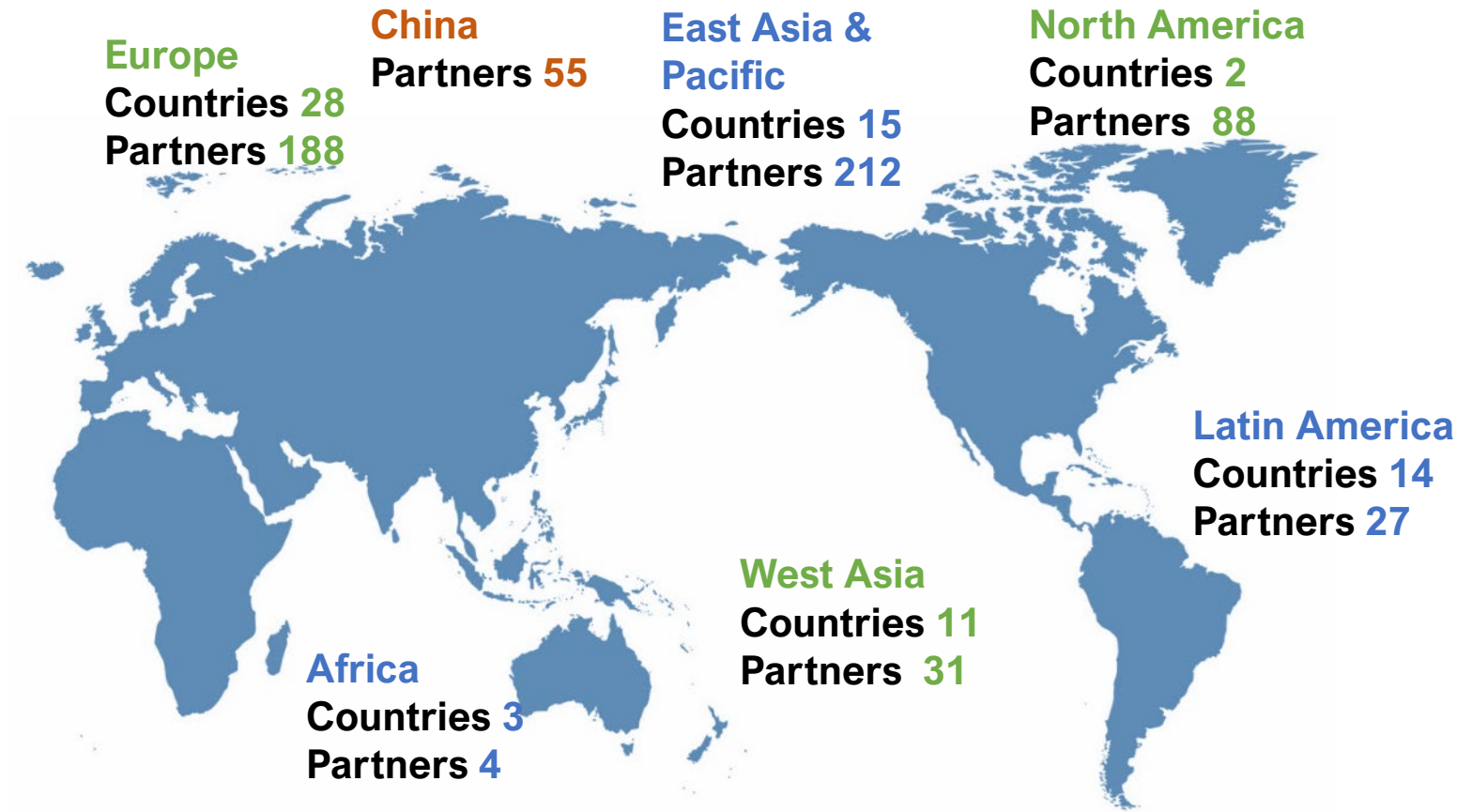
NCCU Griffin has won the UBA championships three times since 2021 and just conquered the World University Basketball Series (WUBS) in August 2023, bringing home a world championship.

Eligibility



You are eligible to apply if you are currently enrolled in a **university-level or higher institution.**

Students must demonstrate English proficiency on one of the following English proficiency tests: [TOEFL Ibt 80/ IELTS 6.0/ TOEIC 880+/ Duolingo Test 110](#). Scores must be no more than two years old and must be verifiable, except for the Duolingo English Test, which must be no more than 1 year old.



Course Plan

- **Dates** : July 8th -Aug. 2nd
- **Course Periods:** English-taught course have 4 themes. Each theme has 1-2 courses, and each course has 3-hours lecture time(on 9:10 -12 or 13:10-16).

- July 27 (Sat.): Discover Tea Culture in Maokong: A Day of Tea Sommelier



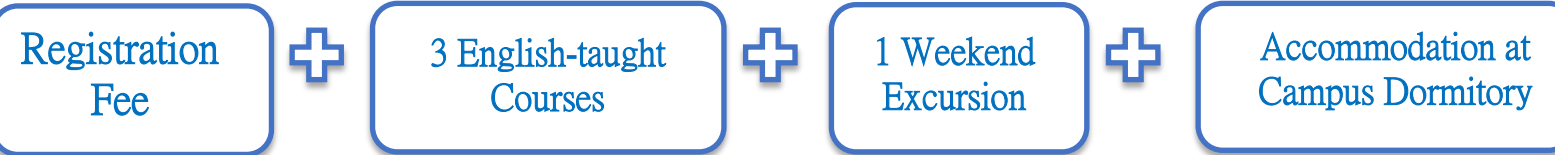

- July 31 (Wed.): Taipei 101 and the Xinyi District

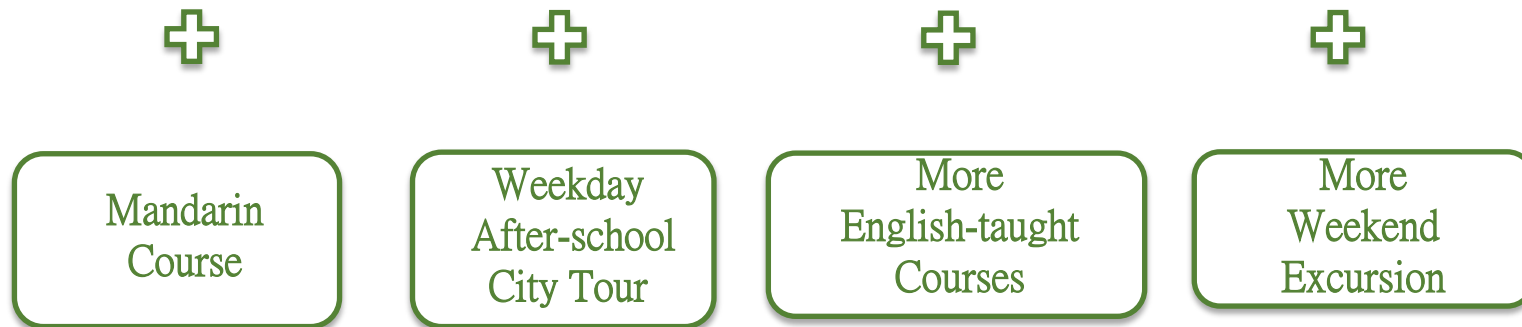
