Purpose of the course unit (module): programme competences to be developed

The purpose of the course is to provide students with knowledge and understanding of international politics, prevailing theories and research methods. Students will be introduced to key problems of the field that dominate in international politics and have influence on current international relations.

This course aims to develop subject specific competences, such as the ability to explain and to apply the major theories of international politics and to use appropriate research methods on individual cases of analysis, the ability to interpret processes in current international politics and explain how they correlate with regional politics. In addition, certain generic competences will be developed: ability to evaluate information critically, ability to draw conclusions and scenarios for future developments based on a variety of information sources, ability to present findings in written and verbal form and ability to respond promptly and comprehensively to questions raised by colleagues or professors.
