EXAMPLE: Qualitative participation at the seminars and lectures	30	Whole semester	Students are required to actively participate in class discussions, critical analyse read articles and problematic issues. To be able to fulfil the class tasks working in the groups. No of seminars 4 divided between the two periods (September & November). Duration of seminars will be 3 hours. Students will be divided into 2 groups. Seminars will be based on reading of 2 novels and a collection of short stories. Students should be able to discuss and analyse Arabic literary texts in translation based on their social, historical, and aesthetical contexts.
