Aim of module: competences developed by the study programme

This course introduces Mandarin Chinese to learners with an A2 knowledge of the language. Students will engage in oral practice during class and learn vocabulary related to various topics, including study, work, living environments, and socializing. They will also study grammar and characters to construct sentences expressing personal opinions and experiences. The course aims to cultivate Chinese language learning skills at the B1 proficiency level.

They will also develop the ability to independently read and comprehend texts related to these topics, enabling them to expand their knowledge and vocabulary through self-learning. Students will gain an understanding of cultural practices and social norms in Mandarin-speaking communities. This includes learning about significant traditions such as Chinese weddings, the symbolism of red envelopes during celebrations, and the cultural significance of <i>kungfu</i> in Chinese history and society, enhancing their ability to communicate effectively and appropriately.
