The objective of the course is to enable participants to acquire mastery of the Croatian language standard and to develop their competence in comprehending spoken and written texts, engaging in oral interaction and production, as well as written production in the Croatian standard language on familiar topics and those related to everyday life situations (such as school, work, and family...).
