Purpose of the course unit

The subject aims to form primary knowledge of the Ukrainian language (up to A 1.), communication skills, understanding of Ukrainian culture and traditions; general sociolinguistic, pragmatic competence, intercultural communication skills. Communication skills in the Ukrainian language taking into account the national characteristics of the culture of communication, knowledge of the Ukrainian way of life. General sociolinguistic, pragmatic competences, as well as intercultural communication skills are developed. Competencies of independent work, abilities to work in a team, to participate in discussions on relevant social, political, and cultural topics are developed.

Number of points collected: max. 10 points. The exam grade is multiplied by 0.3 and added to other points.
