Sports achievements of Vilnius University community members:

At the SELL Games in Kaunas, VU had the largest team in the competition's history – 160 students – winning 43 medals (13 gold, 19 silver, and 11 bronze). VU chess players became champions at the European Universities Games. In the World Inter-Universities Championship in Rome, VU volleyball players won gold, with other medals also earned in athletics, swimming, and table tennis. VU chess players successfully competed in the international student tournament in Antwerp. VU students Airinė Palšytė (Faculty of Economics and Business Administration) and Diana Zagainova (Faculty of Philosophy) participated in the 2024 Paris Olympic Games. In the academic year 2023/2024, 250 students and alumni represented VU in the Lithuanian Student Championships, winning 13 gold, 16 silver, and 23 bronze medals. Notable achievements include the championship titles received by the beach volleyball and football teams. The women's basketball team won the B Division Championship, and the men's team won the Capital Basketball League A Group. The Best University Athlete of the Year became Elžbieta Guoda Adomaitytė from the Faculty of Philosophy (modern pentathlon).

2024 was exceptional for the VU Botanical Garden, which gained international recognition.

Botanical Gardens Conservation International (BGCI) awarded the VU Botanical Garden a certificate confirming its activities meet the highest international standards for botanical gardens.

- Doctoral student Valda Budreckaité was awarded for the best qualitative research paper in Lithuania.
- At the 'QL Future Health & Safety Hackathon' organised by the Poznań Supercomputing and Networking Center (PSNC), the VU team – Gabrielius Keibas, Pijus Petkevičius, and Dr Marco Marcozzi – won second place in the technical implementation category.
- Researchers Assoc. Prof. Dr Rūta Šermukšnytė, Dr Akvilė Naudžiūnienė, Dr Norbertas Černiauskas, and alumnus Dr Vytautas Volungevičius contributed to the development of new general education history textbooks aligned with the updated national curriculum. This year, eight textbooks were prepared for Years 5, 6, 9, and 10, including one specifically designed for Lithuanian schools in North America.
- Vilnius University received special recognition from the European Organization for Nuclear Research (CERN); by unanimous decision of the LHCb Council, the University was accepted as a new institute for the prestigious Large Hadron Collider beauty experiment.
