| Annotation of the course content |
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| <p>The Module aims to introduce students to the critical motherhood studies approach and its uses in a wide range of humanities and/or social sciences as well as interdisciplinary research. The Module is structured around the core notions and concepts of critical motherhood studies:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. 2. Adrienne Rich – the pioneer of contemporary motherhood studies. Motherhood under patriarchy, decolonising motherhood. Motherhood as institution and motherhood as experience. Distinction between motherhood and femininity. Empowered motherhood. 3. Mothering as culturally gendered practices: motherhood vs mothering; Sara Ruddick’s <i>maternal thinking</i>; and Lisa Baraitser’s <i>ethics of interruption</i>. 4. Rethinking motherhood beyond/outside of heterosexuality: motherhood and non-normative gender aspects; Judith Butler <i>sex vs gender</i>; applying <i>queer</i> theory in motherhood studies. Shelley M. Park and a response to the concept of <i>monomaternality</i>. 5. Maternal esthetics: Marianne Hirsh’s <i>mother/daughter plot</i>; Elizabeth Podnieks’ and Andrea O’Reilly’s <i>matrifocal narrative</i>, variations of the Virgin Mary, Frankenstein, Medea and other motherhood myths. 6. Theorising mothers and maternal body as political. The impact of state politics to mothers and their bodies: Michel Foucault’s biopolitics.
