<p>The subject of contract law is intended to analyse theoretical issues of contract law, which consists of two parts – general contract law and specific contracts. The subject examines relationship between contract law, the general law of obligations and other institutes of civil law (general principles of civil law, transactions, property law, civil liability, etc.), as well as interpretation of specific contract law provisions in legal doctrine and case law.</p> <p>Topics: the essence and general features of contract law, principles, regulatory peculiarities and various issues of contract law: formation, formalities, power, interpretation, content, execution and termination of contracts; nature and characteristics of the specific contracts – sales, supply of digital content, barter, donation, lease, work, provision of financial and other remunerated services, mandate, commission agency, distribution and joint venture; the rights and obligations of the parties to the contract, liability for breach of contracts, legislation of contract law in international agreements and European Union acts (relevant EU directives and regulations, United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods, The UNIDROIT Principles of International Commercial Contracts, The Principles on European Contract Law, DCFR).</p> <p>After completing the course, the doctoral student must know the main theoretical problems of contract law, have mastered the system of contract law categories and have knowledge of how the same categories are perceived and interpreted in legal doctrine, legislation and court practice. After completing the course, the doctoral student must be able to analyse the chosen problem of contract law in the broader context of theoretical problems of law, be able to apply various methods of legal research to evaluate and solve theoretical and practical problems of contract law.</p>
