











For the Faculty of Philology of Vilnius University, 2024 was a year of significant achievements, challenges and the beginning of strategic changes. After discussing and approving the new Faculty Activity Plan for 2024-2026, we started to implement its objectives: renewal of study programmes with a focus on contemporary student demands, cost-effectiveness and internationalisation; strategic research management; active and targeted communication; and strengthening of relations with international and social partners. This has already led to substantial improvements in the Faculty's budgetary planning.

The past year has been marked by a number of important scientific achievements. The Faculty's researchers were awarded prestigious international and national awards, successfully completed international research projects, and their books and publications have appeared in journals and publishing houses of worldwide recognition (Oxford University Press, Routledge, De Gruyter, Wiley, SAGE, etc.). We are proud of our active involvement in international academic initiatives and interdisciplinary research, in which we are able to play a leading role, our growing collaboration with the best European and world universities. Last year, a very important collaboration was established with the Sorbonne University of Paris and the Collège de France, funding was obtained to further develop a strategic partnership with the University of Hamburg in Germany, and a new collaboration was launched with the Jawaharlal Nehru University in New Delhi. The intensity of international cooperation is reflected in the significant increase in mobility of academic staff: a record number of Erasmus+ visits within the entire Vilnius University, an increasing use of Faculty mobility funds.

During 2024, we started to comprehensively upgrade or develop new study programmes and/or their modules: in one year, 7 programmes and special modules were upgraded or newly created, 2 of them taught in English for international students. Particular attention has been paid to the communication of the Faculty's activities, to a much more active and professional promotion of studies, and to cooperation with gymnasiums. At the same time, we are intensifying student counselling and mentoring. Faculty's Study Department has been reorganized in order to improve the efficiency of the study administration.

The Faculty community has continued to develop activities of key importance for the dissemination of science, including high-level international and national scientific conferences, topical academic debates and public lectures. The Faculty has also been active in the media and has contributed to cultural education in Lithuania and abroad. Furthermore, alumni, patrons and social partners have become more involved in the Faculty's activities and their communication. The most significant achievement of this collaboration was the establishment of a sub-fund named after Prof. J. Kazlauskas (EUR 140 000) by the VU Foundation, funded by the patrons Romualdas and Eglė Danieliai, with the aim of promoting the Faculty's scientific activities.

These accomplishments demonstrate a consistent advance, as we are nurturing a contemporary, globally connected, interdisciplinary and creative community in the humanities.







## Number of students, 2019-2024




#### Change in the number of students by study cycle in 2024 compared to the average of 2019–2023

## Number of graduates, 2019-2024




#### Change in the number of graduates by cycle in 2024 compared to the average of 2019–2023







Doctoral study visits to higher education institutions and companies with a duration of more than five days


International internship visits under the Erasmus+ programme in 2024


## Academic and non-academic employees

Visits under the Erasmus+ programme for teaching and learning purposes






# Successfully defended dissertations, 2019–2024


# Number of postdoctoral trainees at the University, 2019–2024
