


## **Faculty of History**

## **STUDIES:**

- The Faculty of History has a modular study system, which allows for an even distribution of the study load, active studies abroad under exchange programmes, and involvement in various practical activities.
- Students are given flexible opportunities to craft their own personal studies portfolio: to study subjects from other study programmes, choose minor studies, become qualified teachers.
- According to the international external evaluation of 2021, the bachelor's and master's degree programmes in history scored the highest in Lithuania and were accredited for a maximum period of 7 years.
- Up to 50% of the study period may consist of studies at foreign universities.

## **RESEARCH:**

- The latest international evaluation has given the faculty the highest score for research, the faculty's leadership is recognized nationally and internationally.
- The Faculty of History is the only academic institution in Lithuania that combines important fields of science and studies: history, medieval studies, cultural history and anthropology, archeology, heritage protection, bioarchaeology, memory studies. The faculty also has Cultural Community Studies and Eastern European Jewish History research centers.
- Faculty researchers are active top-level researchers who apply their research results in the study process.



## **PARTNERSHIPS:**

- Students can do internships at top-level academic, cultural, media, or national security institutions that the faculty collaborates with. These include LRT, Lithuanian Armed Forces, Department of Cultural Heritage under the Ministry of Culture, Martynas Mažvydas National Library, Lithuanian National Museum of Art, archives, libraries, schools, etc.
- In 2021, the faculty began collaborating with the University of Cambridge. One of the planned forms of cooperation is a summer school for researchers and students in Vilnius.
- The faculty cooperates with universities in Poland, Italy, Ukraine, Finland, Japan, Great Britain, the USA, Germany, and Israel.
