### <Eligibility>

Eligibility	Students <b>nominated by a partner university</b> and who have completed at least two semesters (or one semester in the case of graduate students)
Minimum Language Requirement or GPA Requirement	Students must be able to take courses in Korean or English as the languages of instruction at PNU are Korean and English (mostly Korean).

Number of Students Accepted	Depending on the condition specified in the Memorandum of Understanding and the exchange agreement, the number of students is negotiable each year.

Online Application	-Spring semester: October 1 - 31 -Fall semester: April 1 - 30 *After the internal screening at the home university, each applicant must submit an online application by the deadline listed by PNU.  *Additional URL for Online Application and Application Guidelines will be offered to nominated students.

### F. Insurance

Overseas Traveler's Insurance	-All exchange students must purchase overseas travelers insurance before arriving in Korea. Exchange students are ineligible to purchase PNU's group medical insuranceStudents must have minimum insurance coverage of <u>USD 100,000</u> to cover any medical expenses incurred while
	outside their home country.  *Students who do not have insurance will have their course registration cancelled and will not be allowed to live in the PNU dormitories.

### G. Visa

Sending a Certificate of Admission	PNU International sends an original copy of the Certificate of Admission to the international affairs office at the partner university by post. Please forward the original to students to allow them to apply for their student visas.
Application for Visa (D-2) Issuance	All students are responsible for applying for a student visa (D-2) using the Certificate of Admission to the Korean consulate in their home country.
