











In 2024, the activities of Vilnius University Library were developed in the following fields: the provision of information services, open science, scientific communication, technological development, heritage collections management, and research.

The most important achievements of the year were: the implementation of the library services platform ALMA (LSP ALMA) and the advancement of Open Science (OS) activities. LSP ALMA, a new generation cloud-based LSP, enables the management of electronic and physical resources all in one place, ensures intuitive search and integration with internal and external systems, and contributes to the creation of a convenient information environment. Notable OS achievements included the approval of the University's membership in the European Citizen Science Association (ECSA), an analysis of the need for OS specialists, the creation of a one-stop-shop OS consulting portal, and two events organised for the first time in University history – the Month of Citizen Science and the competition for the Promotion of a Significant Contribution to Open Science. The latter recognised four initiatives by honouring: Dr Saulius Gražulis, Professor at the Life Sciences Center; Dr Giedrė Beconytė, Professor at the Faculty of Chemistry and Geosciences; Dr Saulė Mačiukaitė-Žvinienė, Professor at the Business School; and the team of the Faculty of History – Assist. Prof. Dr Norbertas Černiauskas, Assoc. Prof. Dr Salvijus Kulevičius, and Vakarė Gotautaitė.

We are pleased with the development of the Library's activities and the growing activity of our users. The utilisation of information resources increased by almost 0.5 million units, while the number of subscribed databases (100) remained stable, ensuring access to the latest resources. The number of training sessions organised by the Library increased by 26 per cent, with eight new topics offered. The number of users increased by nearly two thousand, and overall attendance increased by 5.5 per cent

Library staff delivered 15 conference presentations (seven of which were made abroad), prepared 17 scientific articles (seven were in a foreign language), and wrote 15 texts promoting science. Two researchers who studied the activities of printing houses in the Grand Duchy of Lithuania in the 18th century and the manuscript heritage of the University's researchers contributed significantly to this.

In 2024, 85 events were organised, including commemorative exhibitions marking the 20th anniversary of Lithuania's membership in NATO and the EU, the centenary of the Lithuanian Song Celebration, and significant dates related to key figures who shaped the history of the University: the 130th anniversary of Ona Šimaitė, the 150th of Michał Eustachy Brensztejn, the 80th of Rolandas Pavilionis, and the 100th anniversary of Alfonsas Basalykas. The book 'An Illustrated Handbook to the Early Vilnius Printing Houses' by Dr Ina Kažuro, Mindaugas Marazas, and Dr Veronika Girininkaitė was dedicated to the 500th anniversary of the Book Printing in Lithuania.

Since the very establishment of the eLABa Consortium of the Lithuanian Academic Electronic Library in 2010, the Library has been actively involved in its activities. In 2024, after the University was elected the administrative institution of the Consortium, the Library resumed these functions. A decision was made at the national level to jointly acquire LSP ALMA. As part of its implementation, a joint catalogue of 30 libraries of higher education and research institutions was developed based on the University Library. The Library staff actively contributed their expertise to LSP ALMA implementation activities.

In September, the summer school seminar for CERL heritage specialists was held, and a researcher at the Library, Dr Ina Kažuro, participated in the project 'Bazylianie prowincji litewskiej w latach 1617–1839' (NCN funding from the Polish Research Council). On 31 October, the international EU-funded project EODOPEN (eBooks-On-Demand-Network Opening Publications for European Netizens) was completed, during which the Library and its partners from eleven European countries digitised and published 15,000 documents (the Library contributed 1,063 of these).

Traditional events also took place, including the Christmas evening, 'Festum Nostrum', and team building activities. A new initiative involving civil resistance lectures and first aid training was organised.

The Rector's letters of appreciation were awarded to the Head of the Manuscripts Division, Dr Inga Liepaitė, and the exhibition curator at the Communication and Information Office, Snieguolė Misiūnienė, for her long-term work, research on cultural heritage, and active cooperation with memory institutions.

Vilnius University Library is an academic library of national significance that was founded back in 1570 in Vilnius. It is the oldest academic library in the Baltic States. The VU Library consists of the Central Library, the Scholarly Communication and Information Centre (MKIC), as well as libraries of the academic units.








