**ON THE MATERIAL CHANGE OF THE SECOND CYCLE STUDY PROGRAMME
'DEVELOPMENT OF BUSINESS' OF THE FACULTY OF ECONOMICS AND BUSINESS
ADMINISTRATION OF VILNIUS UNIVERSITY**

In accordance with Article 33(1)(10) of the Statute of Vilnius University, Items 50 and 51 of the Description of the Procedure for the Development, Implementation and Improvement of Study Programmes at Vilnius University approved by Resolution of the Senate of Vilnius University (hereinafter the 'Senate') No. SPN-58 of 18 October 2022 "On the Approval of the Description of the Procedure for the Development, Implementation and Improvement of Study Programmes at Vilnius University and on the Repeal of Resolution of the Commission of the Senate of Vilnius University No. SK-2012-17-5 of 18 October 2012 "On the Criteria for Evaluating the Study Programmes Intended to be Implemented at Vilnius University"", taking into account Proposal from the Rector of Vilnius University No. RTK-10 of 3 March 2025 "On the Material Change of the Second Cycle Study Programme 'Development of Business' of the Faculty of Economics and Business Administration of Vilnius University", Resolution of the Council of the Faculty of Economics and Business Administration of Vilnius University of 11 February 2025 (Minutes No. (1.2 E) 210000-TP-2), and Resolutions of the Studies Affairs Committee of Vilnius University Senate of 4 March 2025 (Minutes No. (1.8 E) 11500-KT-98) and of 15 April 2025 (Minutes No. (1.8 E) 11500-KT-190), the Senate of Vilnius University

hereby decides to make the following changes to the second cycle study programme 'Development of Business' (in Lithuanian, *Verslo vystymas*) (national code – 6211LX085) of the Faculty of Economics and Business Administration of Vilnius University:

1. change the title of the qualification degree from the 'Master of Business Management' to the 'Master of Business Administration (MBA)';
2. change the length of studies from two years to one year;
3. change the scope of studies in credits from 120 to 60.
