Lithuanian is one of the oldest living languages in the world, with a history of over 5000 years, and is closely related to ancient Sanskrit (and has many similarities – words like dantis, diena, dūmas, and many more).

Labas – Hello (informal)

Laba diena – Good day (formal)

Ačiū – Thank you

lki! – See you later

Viso! - Bye

Atsiprašau – Excuse me/sorry

Šaltibarščiai – This one might be useful during the summer. It's a national pink soup served cold with warm potatoes




Meet Your UNIVERSITY!

Things to Do BEFORE ARRIVAL

1. Arrange your accommodation

Securing a place to live before you arrive is one of the most important steps in preparing for your studies. Moreover, choosing to stay with other international students guarantees a fun student experience! There are a few different options for accommodation for VU students:

■ Vilnius University dormitories. These are situated close to the faculties in Vilnius and Šiauliai. You can apply for them on the online admission system at apply.vu.lt. More information about VU dormitories can be found by following the links: Vilnius and <a href="mailto:Siauliai.

If you're looking for alternative accommodation options or will study at the Kaunas Faculty, there are many other options for you to choose from! To make this choice a good one, consider the location, cost and potential roommates.

■ Co-living communities can be a great option for living with students from different countries, getting that community support while also splitting the cost of rent. If you choose this option, be mindful of possible communication barriers, different habits and lifestyles, and limited privacy.

Approach this with open communication, inclusivity, organisation and respect for others to ensure the best possible experience!

Cautions to consider:

- Keep your belongings safe by always locking your room when you leave;
- Make sure that everyone is listed on the lease and has a clear agreement with the landlord;
- Read the contract carefully before signing to make sure everything works for you!

A few potential co-living spaces to explore: <u>SoloSociety</u> in Vilnius and Kaunas, <u>SHED CO-living</u>, <u>Liv-in</u> in Vilnius. Find more here.

■ Renting an apartment. This might be the option for you if you prefer more privacy, therefore would like to live alone or with friends. Private rentals provide more independence, freedom to choose the location and flexible options for your lifestyle.

Cautions to consider:

- Some listings are too good to be true! Don't send money before you see the place or sign a contract.
- Sign a written rental agreement. Make sure you understand all
 of the terms, including the way utilities will be paid, how big
 will the deposit be (usually 1-2 months' rent) and how long the
 notice period will be.
- Registration. You will need to register your place of residence as soon as you come to Lithuania. Make sure your landlords allow this arrangement.

Where to look: trusted rental websites like <u>Aruodas.lt</u>, <u>Domoplius.lt</u> and Facebook groups (main keyword: nuoma (rent)). For an easier decision on the place to live, check the page <u>kurquyenu.lt</u>.

2. Get your health insurance

Even though we hope that your time in Lithuania goes smoothly, it's highly important to be well prepared for every scenario. The topic of health includes both being aware of the Lithuanian health system and having health insurance to cover your medical expenses in case of accidents or illness during your stay.

Your options for medical insurance:

- The European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) is valid for citizens
 of the EU and EFTA countries. It covers all of the state medical
 services in the case of an accident. Please note that it does not
 cover services provided in the private sector.
- Students from non-EU countries may obtain their health insurance either in their country of residence or in Lithuania. It costs approximately 15 EUR per month or more if you obtain it from a health insurance company in Lithuania. More information and a list of companies to contact can be found here.

Will you get help in English? The official language in healthcare institutions is Lithuanian, but many specialists are able to communicate in English. When you register in a clinic or book an appointment, ask if your consultation can be held in English.

3. Get the migration matters settled

Depending on your citizenship, you will have to register in Lithuania or apply for a temporary residence permit. Even though this may seem challenging, you will get the necessary documents and helpful tips.

- If you are a citizen of an EU/EFTA country, you will have to register with the Migration Department within three months after you arrive in Lithuania get a <u>certificate of temporary residence</u> and <u>declare your place of residence</u>. Learn more <u>here</u>.
- If you are a citizen of a non-EU/EFTA country, you will have to obtain a temporary residency permit (TRP) in Lithuania. You must submit the original documents for a temporary residence permit to the nearest external service provider at least 3 months before arriving in Lithuania or to the Migration Department after arrival (if you can legally enter and stay in Lithuania for at least 1.5-3 months).

A decision on issuing a temporary residence permit is made within 2 months from the date of receipt of the application (20 working days of card delivery from Lithuania to the country of application are not taken into account).

A CHECKLIST for Your First Week of Studies

□ Bring your educational documents

You might be asked to bring your educational documents and their certified copies to your faculty. Make sure to bring the **original graduation documents and their translations** into English, Russian or Lithuanian.

Getting a mentor is a good way for you to feel more at ease while settling in Lithuania, as well as beginning your studies. Your mentor will be one of your first friends here!

You can apply for a mentor at the admission system at <u>apply.vu.lt</u>. If you have arrived and have no mentor, find their contacts according to your faculty <u>here</u>.

Arrive, register and start your studies on time

You are required to arrive at the University 1 or 2 days before the beginning of the semester – start of the Orientation Day (27th of August in 2025) and no later than the 1st of September. If you are not able to come on time, make sure to inform your faculty study programme coordinator. Study agreements with students who do not arrive on time will be terminated.

Participate in VUniverse Introduction Days

Starting studies in a different country may sound challenging, but we've got you covered! ☐ Register for the VU IT services

To access all essential IT services at Vilnius University, you must register on the **Identity Management System**: <u>id.vu.lt</u>. This should be done **during September**, but we recommend registering as soon as possible to avoid missing any important updates. You'll need your student's registration (ID) number to register (you will receive it at the end of August). Follow the instructions <u>here</u>.

After registering, you'll get access to:

- <u>VU email account</u> | used for all official university communication
- <u>eStudent Information System (eStudentas)</u> | find all of your courses and exam results
- Virtual Learning Environment (VLE/Moodle) | get access to course materials, submit assignments, and take exams
- Virtual Library | browse academic resources, borrow materials and book study rooms
- **Campus internet access** | use Wi-Fi
- And more | other services to assist in your studies

☐ Get your Lithuanian Student Identity Card LSIC (LSP)

All students should get their Lithuanian Student Identity Card (LSIC/LSP, as in the Lithuanian language).

With your LSIC (LSP), you will:

- get access to the University library services;
- prove your identity as a student at the University itself (especially while taking exams);
- get various discounts in theatres, cinemas, and many other services and purchases;
- get discounts for public transport in the biggest cities of Lithuania.

Cost of your LSIC (LSP):

- 20,00 EUR for bachelor's degree students
- 12,00 EUR for master's degree students
- 22,00 EUR for Medicine and Dentistry students.

Getting your LSIC (LSP):

You can register on the online LSIC (LSP) system at Isp.lt/en after the University registers your data in the Student Registry and you get your student's registration (ID) number. This is usually done in the second part of August.

The whole procedure of obtaining your LSIC (LSP) is listed on the <u>Vilnius University Student' Representation website</u>.

☐ Check out the student groups and other extracurricular activities

By being a part of student organisations, you'll get more comfortable with the international community, make friends and gain valuable experience. The best news is that there are loads of clubs to choose from! While you can enrol on most of the organisations throughout the year, it may be useful to check them out right from the beginning. You can choose from:

- Art groups and other cultural activities. There are 15 art groups, including choirs, orchestras, theatres, and various ensembles with more than 600 members. Also, look out for exhibitions, cultural events and other organised activities! Learn more.
- Sport teams and clubs. Students are welcome at the VU Health and Sport Centre located in different parts of Vilnius (Saulėtekio al. 2, Saulėtekio al. 26 and M. K. Čiurlionio g. 21). For a small fee, you can exercise and join a sports group or become a part of a team! Detailed information about all of the groups and memberships can be found here.
- Societies, clubs and associations. Community and academic activities are a huge part of what makes the student experience.

 Vilnius University Students' Representation (VU SA), scientific societies in different faculties, various clubs for different interests await you to explore! Find them all here.
- The Observatory, Museum, Architectural Ensemble and the Botanical Garden. Explore the most iconic parts of the university perfect for the curious, the creative and nature lovers.

Practical Information

Once admitted to Vilnius University, you need to be well prepared to avoid unpleasant surprises during your stay here. You will find basic practical information on services you may use inside and outside the University.

Getting around

Arrival in Lithuania

You can reach Lithuania by plane, train or bus. Vilnius and Kaunas have international airports. The closest airports to Šiauliai are in Riga (Latvia), Palanga, Kaunas and Vilnius.

You can travel in Lithuania <u>by bus</u> or <u>by train</u> – check the schedules and buy your tickets by following the provided links. **Please note that in**

order to use your student discount, you need to have your Student ID – LSIC (LSP); otherwise, you might not be able to get a discount before obtaining it after arrival in Lithuania.

The discount for intercity bus or train journeys is 50% for full-time students with LSIC (LSP).

Public transport

Lithuanian cities have well-developed public transportation systems. You can use buses, trolleybuses and minibuses.

Students are offered large discounts on public transportation tickets (daily, monthly and yearly) with student cards, and are encouraged to use this form of transportation. Please note that you must always have your Student ID – LSIC (LSP) with you

to prove that you're able to use the discount.

The discounts are:

80% discount on full-time monthly public transport tickets for full-time students

50% discount for one-time tickets Please note that there are various types of tickets – choose the ones that work for you!


How to get your tickets:

- **Vilnius:** Tickets can be purchased by <u>Trafi</u> or <u>M. Ticket</u> apps, or by purchasing the <u>JUDU/Vilniečio (Vilnius resident) card</u> and topping it up. You can also buy your tickets by card by using the composter on the bus. More information and ticket prices can be found <u>here</u>.
- **Kaunas:** Install the <u>Žiogas</u> app to get your tickets with a discount or purchase them from the bus driver for cash. More information and ticket prices can be found <u>here</u>.
- **Šiauliai:** You can get the <u>ŠiauliaiBUS mobile app</u>, buy an electronic ticket card (at the Šiauliai bus station and Šarūno g. 2) and top it up with tickets or buy a ticket from the bus driver by cash or card.

How to get around:

Information on the routes and schedules (available in English for all major cities, including <u>Vilnius</u>, <u>Kaunas</u>

and <u>Šiauliai</u>) is available on the <u>Trafi</u> website and mobile app, as well as <u>Google Maps</u>.



Taxi

Getting a taxi after your arrival in Lithuania might be a great choice. The most convenient way is to download an app – you can get a taxi 24/7!

The most popular taxi apps are <u>Bolt</u>, eTAKSI (<u>Google Play store</u>) App store) and <u>Uber</u>. Please note that while they

cover all three cities, it might be useful to have alternatives prepared if you will be studying in Šiauliai, as there may not be convenient offers from drivers. NEOtaxi (app or phone +370 41 454545) and Euro Taxi (phone +370 41 421111) are available.

Car rentals

Need a car for a few hours or a weekend trip? Fancy driving instead of taking a taxi? Car-sharing services are a widely available way to get around without owning a car.

Get an app, upload your drivers' licence and drive away! You can pay

by the minute or even rent the car for a few days. The main options (available in Vilnius and Kaunas) are: CityBee, Bolt Drive and Spark.

Bike and e-scooter rentals

Exploring Vilnius, Kaunas, Šiauliai and other parts of Lithuanian can be even more fun and affordable while using eco-friendly options, such as bikes, e-bikes or e-scooter rentals. Get the

app, choose a payment method and find your vehicle in a parking space. Make sure to wear a helmet and follow the traffic rules!

Most popular options:

- Bolt Scooters and e-bikes. Available in Vilnius, Kaunas and Šiauliai. Pay by the minute or get a pass.
- Cyclocity Vilnius (orange bikes). Available in Vilnius. Get a pass (the first 30 minutes are free).
- **Moped-Style rentals:** <u>RideMe</u> and <u>Rentebike.lt</u>. Rent for a period from one hour to a week.



Telephone

It is likely that you will need to purchase a local SIM or eSIM card to get cheaper services for calling, sending messages and using mobile data.

You can get a pre-paid card or get a plan with one of the service providers:

- Telia | pre-paid card EŽYS.
- Tele2 | pre-paid card PILDYK.
- Bitė pre-paid card LABAS.
- Saily | eSIM option, convenient for digital setup

You can find the pre-paid card options in most grocery stores, kiosks and convenience shops. If you will arrive by plane, look for the **Narvesen** shops, which usually have a good selection.

Student Services

Having a big community of students, lecturers, administration, and University guests means ensuring everyone's needs are covered. Here you'll find a full list of services for students. Make sure to get the most use out of them during the study period!

1. Psychological counselling

VU students can access a limited number of free individual and group psychological consultations each year. In-person consultations are provided at the psychological counselling offices located in Vilnius, at the VU Faculty of Philosophy (Universiteto g. 9/1), Faculty of Physics (Saulėtekio al. 9), and Faculty of Medicine (M. K. Čiurlionio g. 21), as well as at Kaunas Faculty and Šiauliai Academy.

You can register for consultations by email at bgs@cr.vu.lt or via the VU website.

VU regularly organises seminars and practical workshops on topics relevant to the community, focusing on improving emotional well-being. Information about events and group consultations can be found in the monthly newsletters. Vilnius University community psychologists offer urgent, free-of-charge psychological help to students and employees if:

- You are going through a psychological crisis a tough period, such as losing a loved one, a traumatic experience, etc.
- You have thoughts about suicide or harming yourself.
- You have had severe psychological conditions, such as depression, psychotic episodes, etc., and you feel it may happen again shortly.

You can register for urgent consultations by email at padek@vu.lt or via the <u>VU website</u>. Consultations are available in Lithuanian, English, Russian, and Ukrainian. More information: <u>Psychological Support</u>.


2. Vilnius University Library
